**W**armest greetings of the season and good wishes for the coming year.

It seems as if the school year has just begun and the holiday season is already upon us. It is my hope that you take time over the next couple of weeks to enjoy spending time with your family.

Our students will have completed the fall semester and will be returning on January 6 for the first day of the spring semester. The Redwood staff and administration are committed to providing an excellent education for all our students, as well as enriching extracurricular programs. Students learn to set goals, strive for excellence and properly handle whatever adversity they encounter along the way. This aim is the same in the classroom as it is on the playing field. Athletics is a large part of the high school experience for many students as well as their coaches, parents/guardians and supporters. The principals of the Marin County Athletic League (MCAL) are committed to making this a positive experience for all participants. Integrity, fairness and respect are lifetime values taught through athletics; these are the principles of good sportsmanship. With them, the spirit of competition thrives, fueled by honest rivalry, courteous relations and graceful acceptance of the results.

You can have a major influence on your student's attitude about academics and athletics. The leadership role you take in sportsmanship will help influence your child, and our community, for years to come. Please join us in supporting this philosophy by adhering to school

## Encouraging Good Sportsmanship

- Realize that a ticket is a privilege to observe a contest and support high school activities, not a license to verbally assault others or be generally obnoxious.
- Encourage your team by positively cheering for them.
- Sit in the area designated for your school.
- Welcome the visiting team, showing respect at all times.
- Never throw an item on the playing surface or use a laser pointer.
- Respect, accept and abide by the decision made by the contest officials.
- Judgment calls on the part of the officials are not subject to question or discussion.
- Know, understand and appreciate the rules of the game.
- Questioning an official's call or making negative comments about an official is unacceptable behavior.
- Yelling, booing or heckling an official's decision is unacceptable behavior.
- Be an exemplary role model by positively supporting teams in every manner possible, including the content of cheers and signs.
- Be a good host to the opponents – treat them like guests.
- Lose without excuse and win without boasting.
- Model language and behavior that is non-biased.
- Never criticize a player, coach or officials.
- Recognize and show appreciation for an outstanding play, no matter who does it!
- Follow the rules at all times.
- Mascots and cheer personnel are the only ones who may wear costumes.
- Faces may be painted, but only with a small school logo, mascot or initials, not to exceed 2 square inches in size.
- Artificial noisemakers like air-horns, cowbells, clappers, megaphones and drums may not be used.
- If spectators leave the gym, they will not be allowed to re-enter.
- Doors close at the end of the third quarter.
- Spectators may not bring basketballs into a facility or play during time outs, half time or between games. ■

# A Secure Investment in Challenging Times

There is little doubt we are in difficult economic times. However, now more than ever, the value of an excellent secondary education is paramount to the future success of our high school students. Thanks to the generosity of many Redwood parents, the Foundation has granted more than \$2.3 million in the past four years to improve Redwood's facilities and its programs. The Foundation's financial support, along with a strong teaching staff and administration, has resulted in Redwood receiving the following recognitions:



**A Nationally Recognized High School:** Last month Redwood was honored by the U.S. Department of Education as a 2008 Blue Ribbon School. Redwood is the first and only Marin high school to be recognized by this 25 year-old program.

**A California Distinguished School:** Redwood is a repeat honoree of this award, also received in 1990, 1996, 2003 and 2007.

The Board of Directors of the Redwood Foundation has set a goal of \$750,000 for the 2008/09 school year to insure continued funding of programs that have made Redwood the preeminent high school in Marin County. In addition to supporting academics, athletics, the arts, scholarships and other departments, this year the Foundation has committed to replacing one of two outdated computer labs at Redwood at a cost of \$50,000. These investments in your child's education will not be possible without your donation.

We ask every Redwood parent to participate in the 2008/09 Annual Campaign. We acknowledge the uncertainty in today's economic environment, but remind parents that a donation to the Foundation at any level of giving helps maintain the quality of education at

Redwood we have come to expect. The recommended giving level is \$900 per student – after a charitable deduction your after-tax cost is significantly lower. Compare this to some of the private high schools in our county where annual tuition and other expected giving exceeds \$30,000/year (non-deductible).

If you have not yet made a contribution, please take a moment to do so now. All donation amounts are needed and will be recognized now and in next year's Annual Campaign brochure.

The Foundation accepts cash, checks, Visa/MasterCard as well as stock donations. We even offer monthly payment plans. Please don't delay – your donation is needed today!

Year-end donation reminders: To make a gift by credit card for 2008, we must receive your instructions by December 19, 2008. The U.S. mail is not delivered to Redwood over the holiday break, so if you mail in a credit card donation during this period it will be transacted in calendar 2009. Of course, a donation by check received in January can qualify for a 2008 deduction if the check is dated and the envelope postmarked or delivered in December 2008. Remember, once school closes for the holidays, we cannot retrieve our mail until school reopens on January 5.

submitting it online as the PIN acts as your signature (the process takes approximately three days). If you choose to submit online and not use the PIN as your signature, you may print out the signature page and mail it to the federal processor. Each student must have his or her own PIN; however, parents need to have only one, no matter how many children you have applying for financial aid. It is the student's PIN that opens the FAFSA for completion.

We recommend if at all possible having your income taxes completed for the year 2008 prior to beginning the FAFSA process. If your taxes are not done before the March 2 deadline, you may complete the FAFSA by estimating using figures from last year's tax forms and make corrections once you have filed.

Once the form has been completed and submitted to the federal processor you will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR), which contains all information processed and the Expected Family Contribution (EFC).

The SAR will be sent to you online or in the regular mail. Corrections will be made online, as well as making

changes to the colleges receiving your financial information. If you would like to have an idea of your EFC prior to completing the FAFSA go to: [www.finaid.org/calculators](http://www.finaid.org/calculators).

Additionally, if you do not have a computer at home and need one to complete the FAFSA, there are three computers available in the College & Career Center for students and parents to use. The College & Career Center is located in Room 111 and is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Please call Paula Vantrease to schedule a date and time for computer use.

**COLLEGE NEWS**

Seniors breathed a sigh of relief Sunday, November 30, when their applications to University of California and California State University were submitted. Students who are applying to private and out-of-state public colleges need to check the deadlines for their applications and financial aid forms.

**FINANCIAL AID**

January and February are the months when seniors need to be applying for financial aid via the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and Cal Grant (GPA Verification Form) for federal and state financial aid for college.

Parent and students may go online to [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov) to apply for a PIN (personal i.d. number) when completing the FAFSA and

### CAL GRANTS

May be used only if attending a college or university in California. The form needed by the student to apply for a Cal Grant is called a GPA Verification Form and will be available soon in the College & Career Center. The student needs to complete the student information and have the GPA entered and verified by Charlene DeLosa in the Counseling Office. This forms needs to be mailed by the March 2 deadline. We recommend obtaining a Certificate of Mailing from the Post Office for any forms sent by U.S. Mail.



### Three Types of Cal Grants

**CAL GRANT A** – assists students with tuition and fees at four-year colleges (up to \$6,636 at a University of California campus, up to \$2,772 at a California State University and up to \$9,708 at independent/private colleges). To qualify, students must have a least a 3.0 GPA and their course of study must be at least two academic years.

**CAL GRANT B** – is for students who have at least a 2.0 and whose course of study is for at least one year. Cal Grant B provides a living allowance of up to \$1,551, in addition to a tuition and fee award. Most first students receive only the living allowance which may be used to pay living expenses, books, supplies and transportation, as well as tuition and fees. When renewed or awarded beyond the first year, students may receive the living allowance, as well as a tuition and fee award.

**CAL GRANT C** – is for students pursuing a career or technical education. Course work must lead to a recognized career goal – a

diploma, associate degree, license qualification or certificate that indicates at least an entry level job skill. Courses of study must be for at least four months. Funding is available for the length of the program, if students maintain satisfactory academic progress.

We would like to encourage all of our families to complete the FAFSA and GPA verification forms. This process is the key to the financial aid office at the college your child will be attending. If for some reason your financial situation changes at any time, having the forms completed will speed up the process when dealing with college financial aid officers.

### Mock ACT and SAT

The mock tests are a great way for juniors to try their hand at a practice SAT or ACT. The tests will be given on several Saturdays over the next three months. Sign-ups in the College and Career Center take place two weeks prior to the test date. The cost is \$10 (checks payable to Redwood High School). Students will get their test booklets back and will receive a detailed score report. If you have questions, please contact Paula Vantrease at 945-3641.

### ROP News

ROP will offer a spring course at Redwood in Construction Technology beginning Wednesday, January 14, from 5 to 9 p.m. Students can earn 5 units for this class and need to be 16 years of age or older. Interested students may register by calling 499-5860 or by stopping by the College & Career Center. Other after school and evening classes, such as Auto Technology, Radio Broadcasting and Computer Applications are available to students. ■

# Counseling Updates and Reminders

### SEMESTER GRADES

The last final from first semester is scheduled on December 19, just before winter break, which means that report cards will be mailed after we return for second semester. The scheduled mailing date is during the second week after school resumes in January.

### SCHEDULES FOR SECOND SEMESTER

Students will pick up their second semester schedules at 7:30 a.m.

on January 6. Remember that most courses at Redwood are year-long and many students will have few, if any, changes for spring. Some electives are semester long and those classes, for both semesters, were chosen last spring. Generally we make very few schedule changes in January except in cases where the grade that a student earns prevents him/her from continuing in a sequence.

Counseling, cont.**ATTENTION JUNIOR PARENTS**

Junior Conferences begin the first week of February and continue through May. Conferences, which include the student and parent(s), typically cover a check of graduation requirements and post high school planning including a review of the college application and search process, entrance testing and related topics. Conferences are scheduled during the school day, between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. for 45 minutes to an hour. Look in the next Post for more information about scheduling your appointment.

**ATTENTION SOPHOMORE PARENTS**

Mark your calendars now for the Sophomore Potluck to be held on February 10 at 5:30 p.m. In January you will receive more information about this fun and informative evening.

**SENIORS MIDYEAR REPORTS**

Many private colleges require midyear reports and ask students to mail a transcript containing first semester grades by February 1. Students can check at [www.commonapp.org](http://www.commonapp.org) or a college's own admissions website to see if the colleges to which they have applied require a midyear report. If a report is needed, students should follow the instructions below:

Students who used *paper applications* – either the school's own form, or the paper Common Application – should bring their counselor the form, a stamped (42 cent stamp) addressed envelope for each school, and submit a transcript request with Charlene DeLosa, our Records Secretary, in Room 103.

Students who applied using the *Online Common Application* should come into the Counseling Office to request a transcript to be sent with the online Midyear Report to those schools that require it. This should be done by mid-January. ■

Redwood's application to become part of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Program concluded with a site visit by representatives of the IB organization on November 3-4. We expect to hear by the new year if we have been authorized as an IB school.

We will continue to communicate with students and parents about this exciting program. Please note the following dates:

Friday, January 9 – All freshmen students will attend an IB informational meeting in the library during their English class.

Wednesday, January 14 – We will host an IB informational meeting for parents of freshmen. This meeting will be identical to the informational meeting we held for parents of sophomores in October, so sophomore parents who missed that meeting are welcome to attend.

## MATH DEPARTMENT

Thank you to all of the families who have donated AAA batteries and facial tissues to the math classrooms. Did you know that noses tend to run more during tests? It's not a proven fact, but all of us can vouch for the increased sniffing during assessments. With the cold and flu season underway, please remember us when you see facial tissue on sale...we never turn them down! We'd like to thank the students in Ms. Sugi-Louie's classes who have been so generous: David Zec, Shaina Foresman, Lindsay Berkert-Lima, Henry Turner, Nisha Gujral, Madeline Futterman, Edwin Flores, Lauren Infante, Sophie Nafe and Jake Botts. Jackson Durwood and Jack Stern also brought donations into their classes. To all of you who have shopped for us, thank you!

We received news at the beginning of November that the Reedwood High School Foundation granted us funds to purchase four sets of the Classroom Performance System. The "CPS" is an interactive technological tool that allows teachers to quickly assess how students are doing on a variety of concepts. Each student gets a remote

control that interacts with the CPS program on the computer. Questions are projected via an LCD projector (many of which were purchased for us by the Foundation); students work the problems and then choose their answers. The program keeps a running total of the overall class average and the individual problem average – we can quickly re-teach a concept when student responses show us that is necessary. We have the capability to make a Jeopardy-type game board, insert graphics and equations, and print out reports. If you are wondering if your donation to the Foundation is making a difference, the math teachers would like you to know that it is. Thank you for all of the fiscal support!

Lastly, I would like to acknowledge that we have made amazing strides in the number of students who are taking Advanced Placement (AP) mathematics. When I first arrived here in 1995, only 15 students were enrolled in AP Calculus BC; we had no other AP option for students. Students who weren't interested in taking the fast-paced BC course but wanted to take the equivalent of AB Calculus attended College of Marin. This year we offer three sections of AB Calculus, two sections of BC Calculus, and one section of AP Statistics. While the number of sections of each course change year to year, we have had enough enrollment to offer five or six AP math classes in the past few years. Last year, we had approximately 140 students take AP math tests – every student enrolled in AB, BC, or AP Statistics took the test with more than 90% of the students earning a passing score on the national exams. We should congratulate the juniors and seniors who are challenging themselves in a rigorous (and fun) manner! By the time this article is published, we should know if IB is in our school's future. Rest assured, the concepts that are covered in the AP Calculus classes will still be part of our IB curriculum and students will still have the opportunity to take their Calculus AP exams. AP Statistics will still be offered as a separate course. Stay tuned...

## Mental Health Screening for Sophomores

**M**ental health is central to the overall health and well-being of today's teenagers. If youth living with an emotional or mental disorder can be identified early and their families linked with effective services and support, they can avoid losing critical years of healthy development and growth.

Columbia University developed the TeenScreen Program to offer confidential mental health check-ups for youth to families through the country. This program is included in the National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices as a scientifically verified intervention for the prevention of suicide and mental illness.

For most parents, screening can be reassuring, demonstrating that their teens are just experiencing typical adolescent "growing pains." For others, TeenScreen can help parents identify and address a problem, such as teen depression, early.

The TeenScreen Program is a confidential, voluntary suicide risk and mental health screening program for adolescents implemented in more than 450 sites throughout the United States.

The mission of the TeenScreen Program is to ensure that every American family is offered the opportunity to have their teens

receive a confidential, voluntary mental health check-up. "Our primary objective is to help young people and their parents live happy and healthy lives," asserts McGuire, the Director of the TeenScreen Program.

The TeenScreen Program works by creating partnerships with communities across the nation to implement local screening programs for youth. In the Tamalpais Union High School District, Teen Screen has linked with Family Services Agency to provide the screening and the professional staff to meet with students. Research studies have determined that 10th graders are most likely to benefit from such early screening.

In January and February of 2009, sophomores at Redwood High School will have the opportunity to participate in such confidential screenings. Parents will receive a letter from Principal Nancy Neu outlining this program for sophomore students. ## Save Money (and the World) When Your Kids Commute

Over 21% of Marin's morning commute traffic is school related. Marin Safe Routes to Schools (SR2S) has been working throughout the county with school volunteers to decrease traffic and pollution related to the school commute. Here at Redwood, students in the Environmental Action Club have been working with teen organizers from Safe Routes to Schools and Next Generation to inspire our students to become life long responsible commuters. In addition to the students' events, the school has provided carpoolers with well placed parking spaces, and bicyclists with a variety of locations for bike racks. Many students choose to take public transit.

The PTSA is joining in to support the effort by adding a new committee chair position for Safe Routes to Schools. The SR2S chairperson will work with the students, administration, PTSA and

district cities to encourage our youth to become life long responsible commuters. Future projects may include: a carpool directory within the school directory, the

addition of bike racks where still needed such as at the football field, classes for basic road safety bicycle skills and assistance to the student-led events such as International Walk to School Day.

Parents play an important role in guiding teens to become conscientious, responsible commuters. There are many ways to help. When going to nearby destinations, encourage your teen to walk.

Bicycles are often mistakenly treated as toys instead of transportation. Make sure your cycling teen is well trained to be a responsible safe cyclist. Attend a Basic Street Skills class together offered by the Marin Bicycle Coalition, or at the very least, review the Motor Vehicle Codes as they apply equally to bikes as cars. If your teen has not yet mastered public transportation, look for opportunities to take the bus or ferry and familiarize them with the system. Lastly, once they become responsible and safe passenger permitted drivers, let them know you expect them to carpool whenever it is reasonable. Our immediate joint efforts are essential for a sustainable future, and the habits we instill in our children today are our environmental legacy.

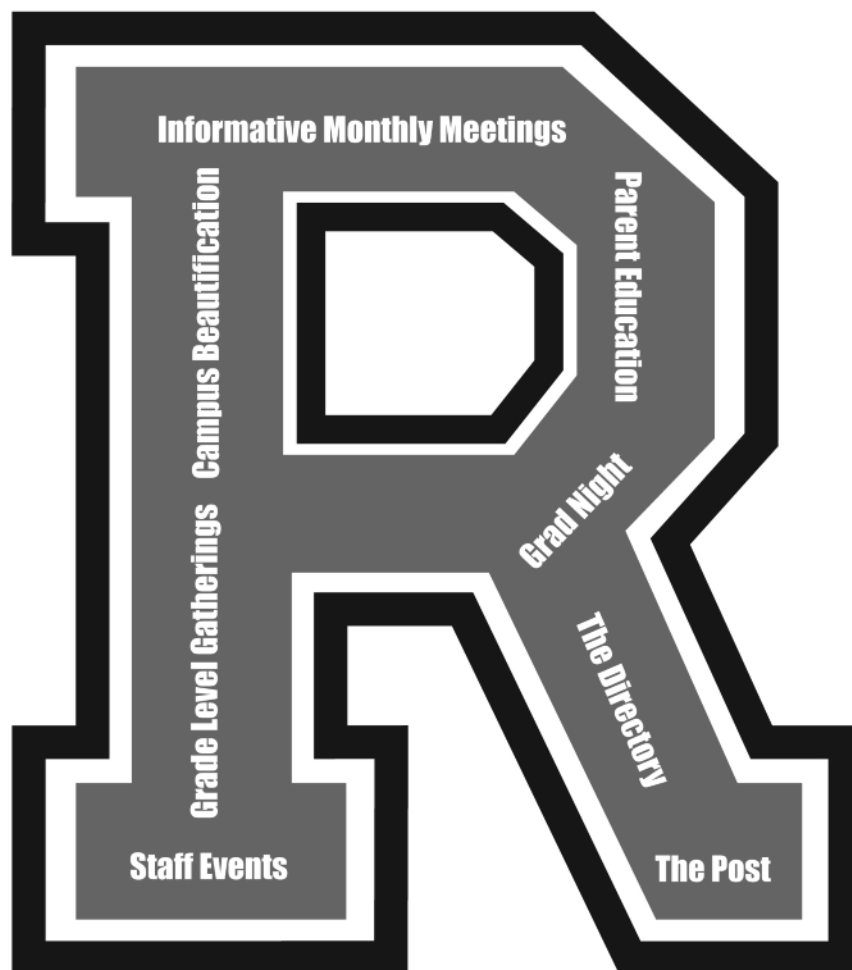
